Frank, of the Second Circuit, and the Honorable Walter L. Pope of the Ninth Circuit. Also

GLEN A. LLOYD, JD'23, has been appointed Deputy to Mr. Harold E. Stassen, Director of the Foreign Operations Administration. Mr. Lloyd is a partner in the firm of Bell, Boyd, Marshall and Lloyd, and is President of the Law School Alumni Association and a Trustee of the University of Chicago.

ARNOLD R. BAAR, JD'14, for many years a partner in the Chicago firm of Kixmiller, Baar and Morris, has been appointed a Judge of the Tax Court of the United States, and began serving with that Court in April.
