TEACHING FELLOWSHIPS  
1947-48**

Teaching Fellowships named in honor of Dean Emeritus Harry A. Bigelow will be awarded for the year 1947-48 to a limited number of law graduates of high qualifications. The Fellowships are offered in connection with the research-seminar program of the school. The Fellowships are for one academic year at a salary of \$3,000. The Teaching Fellows are non-voting members of the Law School faculty.

Applicants should have a record of high scholastic achievement in law school, substantial law review experience, if possible, and interest in experimental programs in legal education. Applications are invited not only from students finishing the work for their first degree in law but also from those who have had graduate legal study or experience in practice, government work, or teaching.

A formal application is not required. The applicant should furnish general biographical data and detailed information as to his scholastic record as an undergraduate and at law school, his law review experience including his position on the review staff and citations to the work contributed by him, and at least three references to members of law school faculty. In addition, if the applicant has had experience in practice, government service, or teaching, he should furnish references and information as to scope and nature of position held.
