Counsel For Defense

Jerome H. Spingarn's biographical sketch entitled "Lloyd Stryker: Counsel For Defense" appearing recently in THE AMERICAN MERCURY describes Lloyd Paul Stryker as "now probably the nation's most redoubtable criminal lawyer" and illustrates his freedom from "qualms about taking advantage of his opponent's mistakes" in these words:

"When Stryker opened the argument in court, he pointed out that the prosecution had cited a case as law in its brief when, in fact, it had been reversed by a higher court. He hammered the point home:

Before citing a case in a brief, every competent lawyer checks it in SHEPARD'S CITATIONS to make sure it hasn't been reversed.
